Important Information:

EXHIBITORS NOTE:

Each exhibitor is responsible for providing his/her own water test equipment; including a U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation device and suitable foot protection to be worn in the water. Each exhibitor is responsible for knowledge of the official NCA Regulations governing Water Tests and the applicable Standards of Performance.

Entering at Own Risk:

Entrants participate in an NCA Water Test at their own risk. Entrants agree to abide by the NCA Water Test Regulations and the Constitution and By-laws of the NCA.

They also agree that any violation of the AKC Code of Sportsmanship, the NCA Code of Ethics and/or the Judges

Code of Ethics will be handled pursuant to the NCA WDC Grievance policies listed on the NCA Working Dog Committee website and event toolkits.

SAFETY POLICY: The NCA and the Working Dog Committee have adopted the AKC official policy concerning dog attacks that lead to an injury, either to a person or to another dog.

Also, Water Test judges may excuse, and even ask to have removed from a test site, if necessary, any dog that appears dangerous to other dogs or persons.

BITCHES IN SEASON

Bitches in season may participate in NCA Water Tests. Bitches in season will be kept out of the test area and away from all other dogs until called for by the judges. Bitches in season shall be judged at the conclusion of judging for that day.

The owner or handler should notify the test secretary as soon as they know they will be arriving with a bitch in season.

UNENTERED DOGS:

Unentered dogs must be kept quiet, on leash, or crated, and away from the designated Test Area.

OUT OF CONTROL DOG POLICY Approved NCA Board of Directors November 11, 2023

At all NCA Events dogs must be kept under control to prevent harm to itself or others. It is the owner/handler's responsibility to ensure their dogs are under control for the duration of the event.

At NCA events dogs must be crated or leashed and collared at all times, except when the dogs are required to perform off leash. When dogs are leashed, the length of the leash must not exceed SIX (6) feet and the leash may NOT be a retractable leash.

Dogs should not be allowed to approach another dog without permission from the other dog's owner/handler.

Any dog that, in the opinion of the judges, event committee or designated safety officer representing the event, appears dangerous, shall be asked to leave the event promptly or be crated for the duration of the event and is excused from further participation in the event. Anyone who witnesses a dog appearing to be dangerous should bring their concerns to the judges, event committee or safety officer. Part of upholding good sportsmanship is to take action through the appropriate channels.

Examples of out of control behavior would include but are not limited to:

Aggressive vocalization such as barking and growling, or aggressive behavior toward any person or animal such as snapping, biting, lunging, charging, attacking or attempting to attack at any time while on the test grounds.

Owners and handlers are responsible for monitoring the well-being and safety of their dog(s). If left unattended the owner/handler must check on them frequently to ensure they are safe.

If the dog is excused from the test grounds for aggression, the automatic grievance policy of the NCA is enacted. If an injury to a dog or person occurs, the AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows Ch 11, section 15 goes into effect. (References, chapter 2, section 14 in both water and draft regulations)

Water Test Entry Information

TOTAL ENTRIES ARE LIMITED to twenty-five (25) dogs each day with a limit of 6 WRDX slots and if the 6 WRDX slots do not fill then those slots may be used for WD/WRD entries. Available entry slots will be filled according to the postmark date. Entries will be accepted via United States Postal Service or Canadian Postal Service only since other delivery services may not provide postmark dates. The responsibility for verifying that an entry is received by the test secretary rests solely on the entrant. An entrant may request confirmation of receipt of an entry in on of the following ways:

*Enclosing a self-addressed stamped postcard for secretary return.

Entry Postmark and Closing Information

Non-NCA Member 1st Postmark Date: 07/18/24
Closing Date: 08/14/24

Entries must be postmarked by 1st Postmark Date listed above or later. Any entries received with a postmark prior to the dates listed above will be returned. The available entry slots will be filled according to the postmark date. If the number of entries with the same date exceeds the number of slots available, a drawing will take place to fill the vacancies and determine the alternates. All additional entries received after the entries fill will be placed on an alternate list by order of postmarks. Entries for requalification will be accepted only if the entry limit is not filled.

ENTRY FEE for 2024 Water Test (WD, WRD, & WRDX) is \$50.00 for each entry per day. ENTRIES CLOSE at 11:59 p.m. on Wednesday August 14, 2024, or before, if the entry limit is reached prior to the closing date. After that time, entries cannot be accepted, canceled, altered, or substituted.

POST ENTRIES: Dogs which successfully fulfill the requirements for a Water Dog title at a test may be post-entered in the Sr. Div. at that test and will be tested at the conclusion of Sr. Div. judging. The handler will be allowed to test their dog until it fails an exercise. There will be an additional entry fee of \$20.00.

Section 16. Requalifications as Multiple Division Entries

Multiple Division requalifications will be allowed at NCA Water Tests for already titled dogs. Dogs may be entered in more than one division on the same day but only if they have already qualified, at previous tests, in all of the divisions entered. Each entry must be sent on a separate entry form. If the entry for the test exceeds its limit and a lottery is necessary, the dog may not get into each division entered. There will be no substitutions for dogs to change divisions if their entry is chosen for one division but not the other in a lottery. Judges must excuse any dog not in condition to finish the division entered and, if so, the dog will not be able to continue in any other division entered that day. Entry fees will not be refunded for dogs that are excused. Entrants are discouraged from pushing their dogs beyond their limits.






<u>Directions to the Site:</u> The Kill Creek entrance is located near 116th and Homestead Lane.


